SECTION 1 - EVENT OVERVIEW

A. The ISIS World Drill Championships SOP

1. The Isis World Drill Championships (IWDC) remain the world's leading competition for post-high school solo and dual (tandem) drill competitors. This international competition is operated for independent, college, military reserve and active-duty drillers. With the motto, "Dare Mighty Things", IWDC serves to take drill to the next level beyond the high school arena.
2. The IWDC will maintain a one-day competition format, with the winners announced the following day during the Masters Level Awards Ceremony of the National High School Drill Team Championships on Monday evening.
3. This SOP will include all information that is pertinent to the competition and necessary for your preparation & attendance at the ISIS World Drill Championships. Along with the rules and regulations of the meet, there will also be extensive information on the management of the event by Sports Network International, Inc. (SNI). The entire success or failure of your competition will depend on your ability to internalize all of the regulations of IWDC. Please familiarize yourself with this SOP in detail.
4. Once you have read this SOP and agree to all of its terms & conditions, please sign and return all required forms by the dates shown on the forms. No individual may compete at the IWDC without the proper submission of all required paperwork (see Checklist).
5. All competitors, instructors, and supporters are subject to comply with all of the rules & procedures of this SOP and of IWDC. Any items not specifically covered by these regulations are at the sole judgment, discretion and determination of the Judging Director.

B. Event Management & Sponsorship

1. The Isis World Drill Championships are originated and hosted by The Drill Jungle creator and drill benefactor, Mr. Abdul Al-Romaizan. The event will be held during the National High School Drill Team Championships which is managed & produced by Sports Network International, Inc.. As the Event Manager of the overall competition weekend, SNI will be responsible for organizing all aspects of the competition, from setting up the rules & procedures, to securing all necessary judges, competition sites, etc. as well as managing the IWDC event. With the event hosted during the NHS DTC, all competitors are urged to show deference and respect to all aspects of the weekend activities, and understand that minor children will be surrounding all aspects of the IWDC as spectators and often admirers.

SECTION 2 - GENERAL EVENT SPECIFICATIONS

A. The ISIS competitor

1. ISIS competitors should have at least many years of experience with military drill to compete - however, if you are good, you are good! The IWDC competition is for the best of the best in post-high school drill. Only those with many years of practice and experience can generally compete with distinction at an event of this stature.
2. This competition is not open for high school drillers (no exceptions – do not even ask!) and you must be a high school graduate or equivalent in order to compete.
3. The ISIS drill competition will be designed to maintain roughly 30 competition slots in the Solo Division and 15 slots in the Dual Division. While returning attendees are always appreciated, the ISIS competition places a premium on having "new blood" infused within the event every year. Therefore, those cadets that have attended previously are welcome to enter, however new competitors will also be sought and encouraged to give as many individuals as possible the opportunity and privilege to be a part of the world-class event.

B. Entry Deadlines, & Refund Policy

1. All registrations will be reviewed by the SNI competition Committee. SNI will evaluate all entries on their merits and determine if an applicant is suitable for the IWDC competition. Any applicant that is not approved will have their registration fee refunded.
2. Interest is EXTREMELY HIGH this year and many people will likely register right away. It is highly recommended that individuals register prior to April 1st, 2012. Only if spaces are still available will any applicants be accepted after that date. For insurance and other reasons, no entries may be accepted on-site for any reason – so please do not ask.
3. Individuals making the decision to attend the IWDC should reserve a competition slot by registering ASAP to eliminate the possibility of being "shut out". However, all entry fees are non-refundable and non-transferable. Therefore, those wishing to enter the IWDC should do so only after making the irrevocable decision to attend!
4. Should an emergency preclude any registered entrant from attending, the competitor should immediately contact Sports Network International. While the Registration Fee remains non-refundable, your prompt notification will keep you in good standing for future IWDC competitions.

C. Entry Costs

1. The Registration Fee is **\$100 Solo Exhibition entry fee and a \$100 Dual Exhibition entry fee**. (Dual competitors can split the fee at \$50 each if they choose but the total fee must be received before the entry is considered finalized.)
2. Any competitor choosing to enter the event after April 1st will only be considered if space remains available AND they provide all of the required paperwork and entry fees immediately. Accepting any late entries AFTER April 1st would be totally at the discretion of Sports Network International.
3. An entry into the IWDC will ONLY be considered official when the official registration form and registration fee has been received by SNI in full. Furthermore, all paperwork and money will be needed by the entry deadlines listed. While SNI tries to work with all competitors to ensure deadlines are reasonable and workable, paperwork and/or money not paid in a timely manner can result in your withdrawal from the IWDC competition without refund or recourse. **DO NOT enter if you believe you may not be able to complete the paperwork and/or financial requirements.**
4. Entrants may pay their entry fees using a credit card. Additionally, no paperwork requires a notarization and much can be submitted on-line or via email! We look forward to assisting all entrants in every way possible.

D. Commander's Call

1. **No Commander's Call will be utilized for this event.** Instead, start times and late-breaking event briefing information will be posted on the event website in advance. On site, competitors will check in at the Event Registration Desk upon arrival. At this time, each competitor will receive an event schedule book with competition times. It also allows SNI to know you have arrived at the event and you are ready to compete. Event Registration is the first thing you must do upon your arrival at the Ocean Center.
2. With no Commander's Call, all questions should be asked in advance via email or telephone whenever possible. This is critical to ensure you are fully prepared to attend and compete at the IWDC.

E. Hotel Information

1. Competitors within the IWDC event may stay anywhere in the greater Daytona Beach area, however SNI will maintain a preferred hotel list for those looking for accommodations. This list will be found [at this link](#) and on the IWDC site.

F. Competition Discipline & General Event Conduct

1. Although discipline problems are not expected at a drill meet of this caliber, addressing problem situations now is the best way to halt any future unpleasant problems. SNI reserves the right to remove any individual from the event for destructive, profane or other conduct unbecoming a competitor at the IWDC. This includes bad conduct in or around the competition site and/or hotels. More specifically, all IWDC competitors must sign & submit a Code of Conduct Form which details what is expected of Isis participants AND all drillers at the IWDC must be members of the Professional Drillers Society. This membership is free and is part of the required paperwork we supply to compete at the IWDC.
2. The ISIS competition is designed for adults and as such, entry and/or inclusion within the ISIS World Drill Championships *is a privilege* which may be suspended or revoked at any time for conduct which the ISIS Competition Committee believes is criminal or simply detrimental to the competition or to the sport of competitive drill as a whole. This may include actions, inactions, or statements made that detract from the competition or cast either the event or those hosting the event in a negative public light. Any competition ban or event removal will not be subject to review nor protest in any manner and the decision of the ISIS Competition Committee will be final. This action has NEVER been taken nor do we ever expect it to be. Should a competitor be removed or banned from the event for this reason at any time either before or during the event, only monies paid to Sports Network International to enter this competition will be refunded.
3. All areas within the facility are totally unsecured. Competitors using these areas should not leave personal belongings unattended. Any abuse of these facilities will not be tolerated. While at the Ocean Center, competitors should only dress in dressing rooms or restroom facilities. Do not dress in the bleachers.
4. Competitors should bring with them all needed equipment to clean & shine shoes, belts, buckles, uniforms etc. Hotel towels or other hotel items are NOT to be used to polish shoes or otherwise ready the uniform. This problem occurs most frequently -- make sure you do not engage in this activity!

G. Awards Ceremony

1. The IWDC Awards Ceremony will occur on Monday evening near the beginning of the overall NHSDTC Masters Level Awards Ceremony. No final placements will be announced in advance under any circumstances. The Awards Ceremony is as much a part of the IWDC as any event. All competitors are expected to attend in their competition uniform.
2. All competitors are expected to attend the ceremony that evening. Failure of participants to attend the ceremony without sufficient cause will be construed as a lack of interest in supporting the competition and may forfeit your trophies/awards and/or preclude your invitation in the future. Should a true emergency keep you from attending the ceremony, arrangements will be made to ship any awards, scores sheets, pictures, etc. to you, COD.
3. A special section will be set aside for seating IWDC competitors and their guests. **The conduct displayed by this group as a whole should be self-policing** and any form of misbehavior or childish antics will be met with severe actions on the part of Sports Network International. Do not let the actions of a few cast the entire group in a bad light (NOTE: This HAS happened previously...don't let yourself be a part of it.)

SECTION 3 - COMPETITION AREA SPECIFICATIONS

A. The Ocean Center Arena

1. The IWDC competition will take place on-site at the Ocean Center Arena in Daytona Beach, Florida (www.oceancenter.com). The Ocean Center has full concession facilities, dressing rooms, ample car/bus parking areas. With a recent renovation & expansion, the facility maintains an elevated seating "Arena-side" and a massive convention-style area that will be known as the "Nationals Village". The NHSDTC will utilize this entire facility and the IWDC will as well.

2. The IWDC does not provide advanced medical services on-site. However, emergency medical services can be summoned at any time for major medical trauma within minutes. SNI does maintain a basic first-aid kit and those needing band-aids, ice, or other basic medical attention may come to the information desk to receive your needed supplies. If you wish to have medical personnel with you, please feel free to bring these people with you and we will ensure they maintain unlimited floor access. Again, should you require immediate medical assistance while at the event, please get to the Information Desk where we can call for an ambulance, if necessary.
3. There is ample seating at the Ocean Center, therefore no reserved seating is in effect for the competition (we do have reserved seating at the Masters Level Awards Ceremony).
4. At no time may anyone block the major flow of foot traffic. Specifically, no one may store rifle crates, dressing racks or other large equipment in these main walkways. For those choosing to bring in these types of equipment storage units, there are open areas off to the side of the seating areas that are less trafficked and suitable for placing these items. For those sitting in the upper deck, there is elevator access for moving large items such as these closer to your seats. The elevator is also available for handicapped access to the upper deck. No other routine use of the elevator is allowed.
5. For the first time, a separate practice area will be denoted FOR ISIS COMPETITORS ONLY on the day of the competition. It will be DIRECTLY ADJACENT to the competition area to ensure the look and feel, lighting, etc. will be very similar to what you will face when competing. This will be the only authorized practice area in the facility for ISIS competitors and will be available in time blocks assignable on-site after you have received your competition times. NOTE: For safety reasons, please do not pick up and spin your weapon anywhere inside the building even while walking except in this practice area. There is ample room outside of the Ocean Center to practice should you desire.

B. Drill Area Specifications

1. All drill areas in use for the IWDC are indoors within the Ocean Center and have a flat, hard concrete surface. Due to the 80' high ceiling heights (minimum) and ceremonial nature of the event, OUTDOOR REGULATIONS are in effect throughout all facets of the IWDC.
2. The IWDC Solo & Dual competition areas are the same size for both events: 33' x 33' (slightly smaller than past years). Entry points and other required items will be shown on the official IWDC Competition Floor Diagram which is posted on the official event website.
3. Drill areas are made using fluorescent tape connected to 20" traffic pylons standing on the floor. All drill areas use a single entrance/exit point. The exact size and location of these entrances are found on the IDWC Competition Floor Diagram. This is the only point where you may enter/exit the drill area – (do NOT ask for an exception – I promise you it will not happen).
4. Boundary violations are penalized when a competitor or his/her clothing comes in contact with any part of the boundary tape or the support cones when properly set. Should the boundary tape or cones become dislodged, a violation will occur when a competitor crosses the point where the tape/cone should have been were it not displaced.

SECTION 4 - COMPETITION RULES

A. Eligibility & Performance

1. Competitors should plan to be at the Ocean Center at least 30 minutes before their scheduled performance time.
2. If you are beyond eager and dedicated to compete and eventually win, it's your responsibility to go and invite other competitive drillers to attend. Entrants will be posted beginning in April and you will be able to track the names and numbers by viewing the updated online roster.
3. Important Note! Any competitor who delays a competition area due to tardiness may be removed from the event at that point – don't be late!

B. Competition Overview

1. The IWDC competition is slated to be held on Sunday late afternoon in the Nationals Village area of the competition.
2. A 3-5 minute time limit is in effect for all IWDC competitions.
3. Judges will be specially knowledgeable and trained within exhibition drill. These judges may be a mix of active duty military, recently retired military and civilians with extensive drill & ceremony background. The exact number of judges will be between 4-6 and they will be not be identified by Sports Network International in advance of the event.

C. Uniform & Rank Regulations

1. All competitors at the IWDC are required to wear clothing that represents a MILITARY FLAVOR while competing. THIS DOES NOT MEAN YOU MUST HAVE A SERVICE UNIFORM, but a military flavor needs to be fully on display in any uniform choice to receive a maximum score in that score sheet segment. **All competitors must compete with military headgear of some kind.** A specific type or style of military uniform is not required. We will allow and instruct all judges that any name tags and medals/ribbons that would normally be worn will be encouraged to be removed during competition for safety reasons.
2. The type/style of military uniform that is chosen is left up to the competitor. HOWEVER, in choosing an exhibition event uniform, competitors should be aware that the event is judged by military personnel with many years of experience. Dressing in a less-than-military fashion (tuxedo, t-shirt, ball caps, etc.) will MOST LIKELY negatively impact the scores you will receive in the "Uniform" section and possibly a points in the overall section as well.
3. We will be fairly loose with the rules for specific headgear because of the many variations. While most services have specific regulations regarding what are acceptable colors for berets, the IWDC will maintain no such regulations.

D. Weapon Requirements & Regulations

1. To compete at the IWDC, the performer's weapon must fit a series of standards that qualify it to be "demilitarized". These criteria include the following:
 - a) A weapon must be rendered demilitarized by leading the barrel or removing firing pin (no fireable weapons allowed-period-automatic DQ if discovered by a judge)
 - b) A weapon must weigh a minimum of 8lbs.
 - c) A weapon must contain both a trigger guard (if trigger is present) and an adjustable sling
 - d) Should a weapon fail to meet ANY of the above criteria, the entrant will not be allowed to compete.
 - e) The use of front/rear sights are strongly discouraged by SNI on any weapon used for an exhibition performance. They can cause severe injuries and serve little purpose on these weapons.
 - f) The required sling must be attached to the rifle in the standard manner; however competitors may apply tape, rubber bands or other materials to affix the sling tightly to the rifle, as well as to decorate their rifle as they see fit.
2. Bayonets are allowed on rifles in the IWDC competition. If a bayonet is used, it MUST have the following characteristics:
 - a) Must be unsharpened and be able to be grasped tightly without sharpness.
 - b) Must be attached in a standard fashion to the end of the barrel (Bayonets must be attached to an upper band that is not compromised and without the bayonet clamping stud missing).
 - c) Must have a secondary attachment for safety (Tape, pull-tie or another high strength method must be in place. There is no limitation on the style or color of this attachment).
 - d) Must be in place prior to the start of the routine so that it can be visually inspected by a judge to determine that it is safely attached.
 - e) Bayonets can be removed during the routine, but CANNOT be reattached during the routine.
 - f) Should the bayonet become unintentionally separated from the rifle, then the routine will be automatically halted and the driller(s) will be disqualified immediately at that point.
3. Competitors may switch rifles during their routine, as well as use multiple rifles. No pre-placement of rifles within the drill area is allowed – all rifles must be brought into the competition area in the same manner as replacement for a broken rifle.

4. Performers may use a rifle/sword combination or simply sword(s) however safety of the driller and of the spectators do not allow the sword to leave the hand of the driller at any time when not in a scabbard. Should this happen, the performance will end and the driller will be DQ'ed immediately at that point.
5. The definition of a "dropped" weapon is that if the rifle accidentally hits the deck with a total loss of weapon control. Should this occur a specific, 25-point per occurrence penalty will be added to the score sheet. Bobbles and other loss of control actions may cause deductions as well. Weapon control is ESSENTIAL to any solid finish!
6. Should a weapon break or become unusable during any performance at the IWDC, a back-up weapon may be utilized by the performer. This back-up weapon should be pre-positioned by the competitor and made available ONLY at the entry/exit area, or may be handed to the competitor AT THE TAPE BOUNDARY by a designated assistant. Under no circumstances may the performing competitor leave the floor and return AND no non-performing competitor may enter onto the floor. No added time will be allowed for such an occurrence. This can be done as many times as you wish during a performance.
7. A broken weapon could become a danger to the competitor, judges or nearby competitors and/or spectators if used during the routine. When this occurs, the performer should replace the broken rifle as prescribed above immediately. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should the weapon be spun or otherwise moved in a dangerous manner when broken. If you drill with a broken rifle, the judges will likely move to a safe distance and then reduce your score in their overall impression segment of the score sheet.
8. Important Note: Judges may (and will likely) visually inspect and/or hand-weigh any competitor's weapon at random either in the event ready area before competing or after the performance.
9. Important Note: Most all judges prefer to be addressed by the rank they have earned. If you are unsure, simply ask the judge before entering the area.

E. General Performance Regulations

1. All exhibition routines consist of stationary/marching drill movements as well as trick rifle maneuvers that are limited by the imagination & creativity of the performer, and the rules of the IWDC. Please keep in mind that this is a military competition with military judges.
2. Competitors may not use a thrown or flip dismount, basket catch/basket toss or other "cheerleading-style" moves during any facet of exhibition drill. Competitors may NOT be elevated in any manner by climbing on other competitor's shoulder, backs, etc., or on top of rifles held by competitors, or other similar maneuvers. Competitors may not be thrown, flipped or propelled in any manner. Impress the judges with your drill, not your gymnastics.
3. During BOTH Report In AND Report Out, each competitor must verbally announce **his/her name, as well as where they are from**. (Note: This is critical --don't make a judge guess.) Other items may be mentioned during report in/out but are not required. The report out should also make clear the performer has completed their routine.
4. No handguns, special effects, props, music or musical instruments, (bugles, drums - ANY musical instrument), pyrotechnics or banners/flags are allowed to be used at the event. Additionally, no horns, whistles, or any other artificial noise-making devices may be used inside the Ocean Center by anyone at any time. During all facets of the IDWC, competitors MAY utilize blindfolds, hoods and/or up to one additional weapon per person during routines. These are the only "props" allowed to be used. If you are unclear, ask in advance.
5. It is common practice by many competitors to have spectators deliver signals to let their unit on the floor know they are approaching their performance time limit. This is not prohibited by SNI so long as the guidelines described above on whistles and other artificial noise-making devices are followed. Competitors failing to follow rules shown previously may be removed from the event.
6. While routines are generally scored only during the time competitors are inside the competition area, for **gross displays of bearing loss** (destructive behavior, loud, foul language, rifle tossing, etc.), judges MAY decide to reduce scores further (up to and including after score sheets have been turned in) within the Overall Impression segment of the sheet.
7. Shoe taps MAY BE WORN DURING ANY FACET of the IWDC competition.

SECTION 5 -IWDC SCORING & TIMING

A. Event Timing

1. The penalty assessed for a performance not falling between these time periods is ONE (1) POINT PER SECOND OVER/UNDER THE TIME RANGE. Time limits are as follows:

Solo & Dual Exhibition.....Min. 3 Minutes - Max. 5 Minutes

2. VERY IMPORTANT: Exhibition performances can maintain motivation displays prior to the actual performer entering the drill area and therefore before the official event timing begins. These displays can be quite involved and therefore are actually part of the exhibition display. Because of this, competitors performing any synchronized display just prior to entering the drill floor for their performance will have the clock start and judging will begin to include this exhibition display. We are not discouraging this action, we are just ensuring this display is judged, graded and timed as a part of the routine. Please ensure your performance does not go over the maximum time limit if you plan to include one of these displays. The official time will end when the performer exits the drill area (because judges have finished watching the routine and are already scoring).

B. Score Sheets

1. Score sheets in use for the IWDC will be posted to the event website well in advance of the event.
2. Complete scoring packages will be given to each competitor immediately following the Awards Ceremony Monday evening. Questions regarding scoring or score tabulation are addressed following the event by telephone, writing or email.
3. Every score sheet is triple-checked by SNI personnel, as well as inputted & totaled on a computer program designed for the IWDC by SNI. The score sheets to be used at the IWDC are located on the web and available for download by each competitor.

C. Tie-Breaking

1. All efforts are made to prevent scoring ties at the IWDC. All event and Overall Championship scoring ties will be broken by re-totaling score sheets utilizing the applicable tie-breaker in the following order:
 - a) Level #1 - totaling only overall evaluation scores
 - b) Level #2 - totaling only Head Judge's scores
 - c) Level #3 - totaling only Judge #2, then Judge #3, etc.

SECTION 6 - IWDC TROPHIES & AWARDS

A. Where the Awards Come From:

1. All cash awards, plaques, and precious event medals for the IWDC event are presented exclusively by Mr. Abdul Al-Romaizan through The Drill Jungle. His efforts along have brought glory and honor to those post-high school drillers who toiled in near anonymity before both The Drill Jungle and the IWDC event was founded. Through his amazing generosity, these cash awards are possible.
2. Mr. Al-Romaizan has again pledged his support for the IWDC. However, if for any reason prize money is not furnished by Mr. Al-Romaizan, SNI reserves the right to provide ONLY The trophies and medals to the winning performers without refund of any entry fees or other costs borne by the participants in the IWDC.
3. NOTE: Simple math will tell you that the event registration fees for all of the competitors COMBINED cannot even begin to pay for the cash awards alone, much less the many other costs that a competition of this type entail. We are forever indebted to Mr. Al-Romaizan for his continued support of this worthwhile glorification of all things drill! Should Mr. Al-Romaizan be able to attend, you should take a minute to thank him personally for all he has done for the sport!

B. What the Winners Will Receive:

1. 1st Place IWDC Finisher(s) within Individual & Dual will receive the following:
 - a) \$2,500.00 Cash Prize money for solo winner / \$3,000.00 cash prize (\$1,500.00 per driller) for dual winner.
 - b) A crystal plaque engraved with the event name, competitor name and championship title for each competitor.
 - c) A Platinum event medal specially designed for the IWDC.
2. 2nd Place IWDC Finisher(s) within Individual & Dual will receive the following:
 - a) \$1,500.00 Cash Prize money for solo winner / \$2,000.00 cash prize (\$1,000.00 per driller) for dual winner.
 - b) A Gold event medal specially designed for the IWDC.
3. 3rd Place IWDC Finisher(s) within Individual & Dual will receive the following:
 - a) \$500.00 Cash Prize money for solo winner / \$1,000.00 cash prize (\$500.00 per driller) for dual winner.
 - b) A Silver event medal specially designed for the IWDC.
4. **NOTE: BEGINNING THIS YEAR, Dual entry cash prize awards will ONLY be guaranteed should 10 or more entrants compete at the ISIS event.**

C. The John Akeroyd Motivation Award

1. An additional \$2,000.00 cash award will be given in honor of John Akeroyd, 1999 NHSDTC National Champion Drill Soloist and Winston Churchill H.S. Black Watch alumni. Cadet Akeroyd displayed a level of drill talent, creativity and motivation that has been the standard in military drill at all levels for almost a decade.
2. The IWDC competitor, who in the opinion of the IWDC Competition Director, has demonstrated the highest unique levels of creativity and talent, as well as great artistic theories toward the art of drill, will receive this award at the IWDC Awards Ceremony.
3. This award is ***completely subjective*** and based as much on the glorification of the art of drill throughout the entire year as it is for the 3-5 minutes the competitor drills within the IWDC. Good drillers who further the art of drill in and out of the arena are best considered!
