2017 Army JROTC National Raider Challenge Championships

THE OFFICIAL U.S. ARMY JROTC RAIDER NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

In early November each year the woods in Georgia about an hour and a half south of Atlanta are overrun with camo-clad teenagers excited to spend two nights in sometimes frigid temperatures. When they get up pre-dawn they are ready to spend the entire day crawling through the mud, carrying heavy ruck sacks while running, navigating an obstacle course while carrying a stretcher, scaling 10-foot walls and travelling across a creek on ropes. For most electronic-addicted teenagers this sounds like their personal vision of hell, but for these dedicated Raiders, this is heaven!

FEMALE DIVISION: For several years Adairsville HS Lady Tigers and Sarasota MA Black Knight Females have battled for the top spot. For two of the last three years the overall champion was determined by a tie-breaker between these two teams with alternating results. This year the ladies from Sarasota MA left no room for doubt as they placed first in four of the five events and placed third in the 5-K Run. Although Adairsville's Lady Tigers couldn't catch SMA's Black Knight Females, they successfully separated themselves from the rest of the pack by five placement points. They placed first in the 5-K Run, second in both Gauntlet and Rope Bridge, fourth in CCR and just barely out of trophy range with sixth in PTT. The next closest competitor was Francis Lewis HS Patriot Strength and they look poised to unseat one of the top two in the 2017 rematch.

MIXED DIVISION: The Mixed Division is always fun to watch where both males and females work together to maximize each other's strengths. The trophies for top five placements were spread across nine teams but this year a dark horse who placed 6th overall in 2015 jumped ahead of last year's champion. North Fort Myers HS Mixed Red Knights took home top honors and was the only team to place in the top three in all five events (1st Gauntlet & CCR; 2nd Rope Bridge; 3rd PTT & 5-K Run). Last year's champion Georgia Military Prep HS had to battle to win the tie-breaker with Grissom HS. They both placed in the top four in all events but Georgia Military Prep won the tie to grab the Overall Runner Up title.

MALE DIVISION: In the hotly contested Male Division, the overall standings mirrored those of 2016. Riverside MA once again dominated the field as they placed first in four of the five events falling just shy of first in the Gauntlet. Sarasota MA and Adairsville HS battled for the Runner Up placement once again as the two teams were the only others to place within the top five in all five events. However with Sarasota placing 2nd in CCR and Rope Bridge and 3rd in PTT, 5-K Run, and Gauntlet, they beat out Adairsville by three placement points (1st Gauntlet; 2nd 5-K Run, 4th PTT & Rope Bridge; 5th CCR). We expect these teams to come ready to fight once again this November but there are many teams practicing just as hard, ready to upset these power-house teams.

The following morning, the Ultimate Raider competition was held for the all-star cadets from each school. A frenzied crowd cheered on the herculean efforts by these cadets as they raced through, around and in the woods, then up and over a high wall to conclude the event. Grabbing Best Female Raider was Cadet Myers from Grissom HS and flying home with Best Male Raider was Cadet Love from Haines City HS.

The Raiders Nationals competition is sponsored by U.S. Army Cadet Command and supported by the amazing men and women of the Georgia National Guard who serve as judges for this unique and challenging event. Cedar Shoals HS under the direction of LTC Eric Cleveland work very hard each year, spending countless hours making sure the course and all of the gear are ready for the event.

All-Service Raider Challenge Championships

Molena, Georgia

Raider is growing in all services and this is the laboratory for it to grow !



The All-Service Challenge Championships event is the perfect showcase for hard-charging Raider teams from all services. It is open to all high school raider teams and is held at the Gerald Lawhorn Scouting Base in Molena, Georgia which is the ideal location for Raider events. The single-day championship event is an off-shoot of the popular Army JROTC Raider Service Championships.

The 2016 event held on Friday, November 4th was filled with Army, Marine Corps, and Air Force JROTC units. 24 teams competed in two divisions (Male and Mixed) within four events: Physical Team Test, 5-K Run, Gauntlet, and Rope Bridge.

MIXED DIVISION

Nine different teams within the Mixed Division went home with at least one trophy but only two schools trophied within the top three in every event. **Sarasota MA** (USA) and **Smith Cotton HS** (USA) dominated the field overall but were very evenly matched against one another. Sarasota MA Black Knights placed 1st in PTT and Gauntlet, 2nd in Rope Bridge, and 3rd in the 5-K Run. Smith Cotton HS Black Tigers placed 1st in the 5-K Run,

2nd in PTT and Gauntlet and 3rd in Rope Bridge. The Black Knights edged out the Tigers by only one placement point as they captured the Overall Mixed Division Championship.

Other impressive finishes included **Fairview HS** (USA) that finished 1st in Rope Bridge and 5th in the other three events; **Coronado HS** (USMC) 2nd-5K Run; **White County HS** (USA) 3rd-PTT & Gauntlet; E.C. Glass HS (USAF) 4th-Gauntlet; **Hendersonville HS** (USMC) 4th-5K Run & Rope Bridge; **Salem HS** (USMC) 4th-PTT; and **William Byrd HS** (USAF) 5th-Rope Bridge.

MALE DIVISION

Of the 13 teams in the Male Division the hardware was split among eight teams with only one team placing in the top five in all four events. **Riverside MA Devils** (USA) came very close to a clean sweep by placing 1st in PTT, Gauntlet, and Rope Bridge and 2nd in the 5-K Run earning them the Male Division Overall Championship title. There were four teams that placed in three of the four events but **Clarkrange HS** Buffaloes (USA) was able to edge out the competition and grab the Runner Up

title by placing 2nd in Gauntlet and Rope Bridge, 4th in PTT, and just barely missing with 6th place in 5K Run.

Des Moines Central Campus HS (USA) took 1st in 5-K Run and 3rd in both PTT and Gauntlet. Only a disappointing disqualification on the Rope Bridge event kept them from possibly grabbing the Runner Up slot. The other schools managing to place in three of the four events included **Union HS** (USA) who placed 3rd in 5-K Run and 5th in both the Gauntlet and Rope Bridge and **Georgia MA Team B** who took 4th in the 5-K Run and Gauntlet and 5th in PTT.

Other finishes included **Hendersonville HS** (USMC) 3rd-Rope Bridge and 5th-5K Run; **Georgia Military Prep HS** Team A (USA) 2nd-PTT; and **Hiram HS** (USA) 4th-Rope Bridge.

This one-of-a-kind all-service Raider event will continue to grow in the future. Registrations are now closed for the 2017 event but we would love to see your team in November 2018. For more information on the All-Service Raider Challenge Championships, go to the home of the event:

This first-year JROTC Fitness Challenge was a fun, high-energy competitive event with teams from Florida, Louisiana, Illinois, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, South Carolina, and Texas. The cadets had a great time competing in five team events: Physical Team Test, 3-K Beach Run, Standing Broad Jump, Seated Power Throw, and Pull-Ups/Flexed Arm Hang. It was a perfect day on the World's Most Famous Beach directly behind the beautiful Plaza Resort & Spa.

MIXED DIVISION

In the Mixed Division, the AFJROTC Spartan Bears from **William J. Brennan HS** in San Antonio, Texas won two first place trophies (PTT, 3-K) and third place in the other three events. For the overall championship, this tied them with the **Colts Neck HS** MCJROTC Mustangs from Colts Neck, NJ who won first place in the Power Throw, second in Broad Jump and Pull-Up/Flexed Arm Hang, and third

place in PTT and 3-K. However, the Spartan Bears won the tie-breaker by placing first in the most events crowning them the champions with the Mustangs grabbing the Runner-Up title.

MALE DIVISION

In the Male Division, the Warriors from **Wando HS** AFJROTC from Mt. Pleasant, SC dominated. They won first place in all events except for PTT where they placed second landing them firmly in position for the National Championship in the Male Division. Following close behind were the Cowboy Raiders from **Southwood HS** AJROTC from Shreveport, LA who captured the remaining first and second places.

Next year's event will be held on Saturday, 5 May 2018 and is expected to be bigger and better.

U.S. Army Cadet Command JROTC National Drill Championships



1,800 Army JROTC cadets descend on Louisville to fight for top honors at the Army Nationals

The 2017 Army Nationals in Louisville, Kentucky hosted 68 schools all the way from Hawaii to New York and 20 other states in between. Over 3,000 cadets, instructors, and spectators attended the event at the Kentucky Exposition Center to show off the hard work and skill of these amazing cadets.

ARMED DIVISION

For the first time since the inception of the Army Nationals in 2004, one team managed to capture first place in all four events! The **Grant HS Maroon Knights** from Dry Prong, LA will go down in the history books. This clean sweep was quite an accomplishment with such a large competition field of 49 teams. The Maroon Knights who successfully defended their championship title from 2016 left no doubt that they are the team to beat next year.

The rest of the trophies were spread out among ten other teams but only one placed in three of the four events. The Golden Talons from **Airport HS** in West Columbia, SC placed 2nd in Exhibition, 3rd in Regulation, and 4th in Color Guard giving them enough of an edge over the competition that they took home the Runner Up trophy as well.

Other notable finishes included: **East Carter HS** (2nd Regulation, 4th Inspection); **Marmion Academy** (3rd Exhibition, 4th Regulation); **Theodore Roosevelt HS** (3rd Inspection, 5th Color Guard); **Smith Cotton HS** (3rd Color Guard, 5th Inspection); **Union HS** (2nd Inspection); **West Creek HS** (2nd Color Guard).

UNARMED DIVISION

The Unarmed Division top teams are an ever-changing landscape as different schools find their way into the top slots each year.

This year's top 10 overall consisted of four teams that did not attend last year, two teams that didn't break into the top 10, and four schools that made it in 2016. Of these, the 2016 champion was unable to maintain their title. **Theodore Roosevelt HS Riderettes** placed 1st in Regulation and Exhibition and 3rd in Inspection but a very disappointing 19th place finish in Color Guard prevented them from back-to-back championships but was enough to land them in the Runner Up position.

This year, there really was no stopping the Lady Chargers from **North Miami Beach Sr. HS**. They placed 4th overall in 2016 but came this year with a vengeance capturing 1st in Inspection, 2nd in Regulation and Color Guard, and 3rd in Exhibition. They were the only team to trophy in all four events earning them the Unarmed Division Championship title.

Other top placements included: **Brackenridge HS** (1st Color Guard); **Ridge Community HS** (2nd Inspection, 4th Regulation); **Smith Cotton HS** (2nd Exhibition, 4th Inspection & Color Guard); **Ronald Reagan HS** (3rd Regulation, 5th Inspection); and **Caddo Magnet HS** (3rd Color Guard).

For the 2018 Army Nationals, we will be moving from a 25,000/sf area into a very spacious 216,000/sf expo hall. Attending schools will have plenty of space to carve out a corner to store their gear between performances. The Kentucky Expo Center is very conveniently located next to the Louisville International Airport where there are many hotels available to accommodate attendees. The Army Nationals keeps getting better and better every year. We congratulate all of the competitors on a job very well done! See you in 2018.

Air Force JROTC Cadets Shine

Air Force cadets impressed in cities across the country.

Air Force Cadets showed up and impressed in several cities across the Nation!

MID-VALLEY REGIONAL DAYTON, OHIO

The Armed Division was once again dominated by **Tom C. Clark HS** from San Antonio, TX. They placed 1st in Regulation, Color Guard, and Exhibition and 2nd in Inspection handily capturing the Overall Championship in this division. **East Paulding HS** from Dallas, GA was close on their heels taking the 1st and 2nd placements not captured by Clark giving them the Runner Up trophy.

In the Unarmed Division, **Tom C. Clark's Silver Valor** also captured top honors by placing 1st in Regulation, 2nd in Inspection and Exhibition, and 5th in Color Guard. Both **Lowell HS** from Lowell, MA (1st Inspection & Exhibition, 4th Regulation) and **West Aurora HS** from Aurora, IL (1st Color Guard, 3rd Exhibition) were close behind but Lowell's Red Raiders near miss with 6th place in Color Guard still gave them enough points to best West Aurora and take home the Runner Up title.

SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

San Antonio has been referred to as the "hot bed" of drill and it is absolutely true. There must be something in the water because the local schools are extremely strong in all aspects of drill. In the Armed Division again this year, **John Jay HS Silver Eagles** came out on top by taking 1st in Color Guard and Exhibition, 2nd in Regulation, and 3rd in Inspection. Two teams fought for the Runner Up spot and both **Brandeis HS Nighthawks** (1st Inspection, 2nd Color Guard, 3rd Regulation & Exhibition) and **Tom C. Clark HS Centurion Guard** (1st Regulation, 2nd Inspection & Exhibition, 4th Color Guard) came

on strong. At the end of the day, only 9 points out of 4000 separated the two teams but Clark's team edged ahead taking home the Runner Up trophy.

The Unarmed Division came down to a two-horse race as the champion and runner up from 2016 again battled for the top spot. But after the scores were tallied, **Brandeis HS Blue Aces** defended their title by placing 1st in Regulation, Color Guard, and Exhibition and 2nd in Inspection. **Tom C. Clark HS Silver Valor** grabbed 1st in Inspection and 2nd in the other three events placing them firmly in position for the Runner Up title.

GEORGIA STATE DRILL MACON, GEORGIA

This drill meet was limited to AFJROTC units from schools within the state. Over the past few years, **Jefferson HS** and **East Paulding HS** dominated both the Armed and Unarmed divisions and the same was true this year in the Armed Division as the **East Paulding Black Hawks** captured 1st in all but Regulation where they grabbed 2nd landing them solidly in the Championship spot and **Jefferson HS Dragons** took the remainder of the 1st and 2nd place trophies giving them the Runner Up title.

East Paulding did not participate in the Unarmed Division this year, leaving room for other teams to shine. **Jefferson HS Unarmed Dragons** still reigned with 1st in Regulation, Color Guard, and Exhibition and 2nd in Inspection but the remainder of the top five trophies were spread among six other teams. Separating themselves from the competition field and showing their overall strength were the **Strike Eagles** from **Collins Hill HS** as they captured 1st in Inspection, 2nd in Exhibition, and 3rd in Regulation and Color Guard giving them the needed points to take home the Runner Up trophy.

AIR FORCE JROTC NATIONAL DRILL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The top two teams from each division from both Regional competitions received priority acceptance into the Nationals in Daytona Beach if they chose to attend. The top scoring Air Force JROTC teams in Daytona Beach are crowned the Air Force Nationals Champions in both the Armed and Unarmed Divisions. The **Blue Aces** from **Brandeis HS** received the 2017 Air Force National Championship in the Unarmed Division and **Tom C. Clark HS Silver Valor** captured the Unarmed Runner Up title. In the Armed Division, **John Jay HS Silver Eagles** handily took top honors with the **Centurion Guard** from **Tom C. Clark HS** close behind taking home the Armed Division National Runner Up title.

NAVY NATIONALS

Academic, Athletic & Drill Championship



24 schools from 15 states across the nation descended on NAS Pensacola in an effort to best their competitors in an all-around fight for the elusive title of National Champion.

Every April, the best of the best from each Area in Navy JROTC travel far and wide to test their overall strength in the arduous Navy JROTC Academic, Athletic, & Drill Championship. The competition is always fierce and a genuine treat for competitors and spectators alike. These tenacious young men and women converge annually on the home of the Blue Angels, NAS Pensacola, Florida to compete for the highly coveted title at the "Navy Nationals." The competition is a totally unique experience in the world of high school athletics through its variety and intensity.

Much like active-duty military life can be, the event maintains "hours of waiting followed by minutes of terror!" A long 14-hour competition day kicks off the event beginning at 0700 where everyone faces the meticulous Unit Personnel Inspection (UPI). There, hard-boiled Navy Recruit Division Commanders scour each cadet looking for any weakness. Winning UPI is difficult, every cadet is scored and every point matters since this event alone accounts for 1500 total points toward the overall championship. Less than 50 points separated the top five with two Florida schools landing on top.

Boca Raton HS grabbed first place with **Escambia HS** following only 20 points behind. Cadets at the Navy Nationals must be not only accomplished drillers, but have athletic prowess as well. Each team is tested in four athletic events: Push-Ups, Curl-Ups, 8x220 Oval Relay, and 16x100 Shuttle Relay. Strength, speed, and stamina are all tested and this year **Sprayberry HS** from Marietta, Georgia reigned supreme. They took first place in three of the four events (Push-Ups, Curl-Ups, Shuttle Relay) which placed them in top position to take home the Athletic Overall trophy. The remainder of the placements were spread among nine teams with no other team capturing a top five place in more than two events. In order to dominate in the Athletic competition, teams must be able to do it all and do it well. After an exhausting afternoon at the athletic field 15 cadets from each team regroup, grab some chow, and head to a classroom for a very difficult 100 question exam that challenges their Navy knowledge. Questions are drawn from different sources including textbooks, the Cadet Field Manual, and current events. It is a very hard test to study for as evidenced by only two cadets out of 360 scored higher than 80%

(Cadet Yang 85% from **Troy HS** and Cadet Rowan 82% from **Gaither HS**) and only 16 more scored above 70%. With five cadets placing in the top 10, **Gaither HS** from Tampa, Florida earned 1st place in the Academic competition with **Boca Raton HS** only 9 points behind grabbing 2nd place. On Saturday morning, the fight for the title in Overall Drill begins. Teams perform in Armed Basic, Unarmed Basic, Armed Exhibition, Unarmed Exhibition and the scores from the Color Guard competition from Friday are added as well. Although five teams placed in the top five in three of the five events, **Green Run HS** from Virginia Beach, Virginia managed to achieve just shy of 1900 points out of a possible 2000. They placed first in Armed Exhibition, second in Armed Basic, and third in Unarmed Exhibition and they didn't achieve top five in the other two events, they placed high enough to land them the Drill Overall first place trophy.

Centennial HS from Las Vegas, Nevada came in just 10 points behind placing second in Unarmed Exhibition and fourth in both Armed and Unarmed Basic which gave them second place Overall Drill. At the end of the day, the National Championship trophy is the Holy Grail and in order to take it home, a team has to be strong in all areas. The excitement was palpable in the beautiful National Naval Aviation Museum's atrium where **Rear Adm. Michael S. White, Commander, Naval Service Training Command** was poised ready to award the Navy Nationals overall trophies. Capturing fifth place was **Escambia HS**, fourth was **Troy HS**, third went to **Centennial HS** and Overall Runner Up went to **Boca Raton HS**. Tension mounted as everyone wondered who had the points. So many schools received the parade of trophies given throughout the evening that it was impossible to guess and the entire atrium exploded with applause as **Green Run HS** was announced as the Navy Nationals Grand Champion for the first time ever. This incredible event could not happen without the help of the extremely knowledgeable judges from the Navy Recruit Division Commanders (RDCs) and Marine Corps drill instructors from Officer Training Command (OTC), Naval Station Newport, Rhode Island who annually support the event.





National High School Drill Team Championships ~ Daytona Beach

UNITS ARE "UP TO THE CHALLENGE"

The 2017 Challenge Level competition of the National High School Drill Team Championships in Daytona Beach, Florida included 43 schools from 21 different states representing all four services showing that it is certainly a well-rounded and diverse field of cadets. This level allows newer or less-experienced teams the chance to excel on the national stage.

ARMED DIVISION

With 35 teams competing within the Armed Division, this year the 20 event trophies (1st – 5th in four events) were spread out among 16 different teams with only one team capturing three top five placements. This well-rounded strength placed **Lynn English HS Bulldogs** at the top of the leaderboard. This Marine Corps JROTC unit from Lynn, Massachusetts sailed to the top capturing first in Regulation, second in Color Guard and fourth in Exhibition giving them the championship title.

The Runner Up title went to the Army JROTC unit, **Smith Cotton HS Black Tigers** from Sedalia, Missouri who took home second in Inspection and fifth in Color Guard. They stayed within the top ten in the other two events which placed them firmly in the number two spot.

Other notable finishes included: **William J. Brennan HS** AFJROTC (3rd Overall, 2nd Regulation); **Dixie Hollins HS** AJROTC (1st Exhibition); **Gen. Benjamin O Davis HS** AFJROTC (1st Inspection); **Rutland HS** MCJROTC (1st Color Guard); **Loudoun County HS** NJROTC (2nd Exhibition).

UNARMED DIVISION

The Unarmed Division contained 27 teams and to underline the all-service nature of the Nationals, the top four teams overall were each from a different service. But capturing the top spot were the Panthers from **Springboro HS**. This Air Force JROTC unit from Springboro, Ohio took home first in Regulation, second in Inspection, and third in Exhibition securing their championship.

An Army JROTC unit landed in the Runner Up position. The Lady Vikings from **North Salem HS** in Salem, Oregon maintained strength across the

board as well by being the only other team to take home three top-five trophies (2nd Exhibition, 4th Inspection, 5th Color Guard) and just missed in Regulation by placing sixth.

Other notable finishes included: **Southwest HS** NJROTC (3rd Overall, 1st Inspection, 2nd Regulation); **Reading HS** MCJROTC (4th Overall, 3rd Inspection, 4th Exhibition); **West Aurora HS** AFJROTC (1st Color Guard, 5th Exhibition); **Waller HS** AFJROTC (1st Exhibition, 3rd Regulation); **Lebanon HS** AFJROTC (2nd Color Guard).

The number two position was a fight between **Francis Lewis HS** Patriot Guard from Fresh Meadows, NY and **Grant HS** Maroon Knights from Dry Prong, LA as both teams captured a top five placements in all five team events. But the Patriot Guard edged to the front during the final Platoon Exhibition event and succeeded in taking home the Championship Runner Up trophy.

The ladies are back! For 15 years, **Fern Creek HS** Lady Leathernecks from Fern Creek, Kentucky had a death-grip on the Mixed Division title. They stumbled in 2015 but came back strong last year and repeated their title again this year. The Lady Leathernecks almost swept the division with a first in four of the five events and second only in Regulation Drill destroying the competition! We'll have to wait and see if the dynasty continues in 2018 and beyond because there's a Mustang in the barn looking to run through the Kentucky dynasty.

John Jay HS has a proven drill program with their Marching Mustangs JV team winning the Armed Division of the Challenge Level in 2016. This year they moved into the Masters Level Mixed Division with the co-ed composition of their team. It was quite a surprise to other schools when these newbies captured the Runner Up title. If they maintain this trajectory, the Lady Leathernecks might have a strong fight on their hands in 2018.






Unarmed Division



In past years, the Unarmed Division has had several teams that had a real shot at the top prize but this year, two teams rose to the very top. **Brandeis HS** Blue Aces and **Francis Lewis HS** Patriot Pride. They took home first in Regulation and Element Exhibition, third in Color Guard and Flight Exhibition, and fifth in Inspection. However, when the scores were tallied, they missed the top spot by a mere 85 points out of 6000.

Even though they only received four event trophies, Francis Lewis' Patriot Pride managed to maintain high placements in all five events, first place in Color Guard and Flight Exhibition, second in Regulation, fourth in Inspection, and seventh in Squad Exhibition. Even the slight miss in Squad Ex didn't knock them off of the championships pedestal. However, after two years in the Runner Up spot, Brandeis will be coming back with a vengeance next year.


2017 Drill Hall of Fame Inductees

Lieutenant Colonel Peter Duggan / Captain Joseph Matthews Lincoln High School MJROTC, Yonkers, New York

LtCol. Duggan and Captain Matthews became a team united. They maintained both an armed team and an unarmed team. The program flourished on and off the drill floor. After dominating Marine Corps drill for several years locally and going head to head with all-service greats including the famed LaSalle Military Academy drill program, Lincoln H.S. MCJROTC brought their excellence to the National High School Drill Team Championships. For over ten years, they competed against the best teams in the nation despite their tiny program size gaining more than their share of team and individual awards. Both Duggan and Matthews benefited the greater drill community in many ways. They hosted scores of meets over the years attending and dominating over 100 meets together during their tenure. Their innovation brought forth the Challenge & Masters concept at the Nationals. This bifurcation better allowed small schools with limited numbers or newer programs just getting their drill programs underway the ability to compete on a more fair playing field. They also brought forth new ideas regarding drill area entry & event staging, vendor inclusion as well as other important logistical considerations that improved the National Championships as well as other meets they hosted. They were quick to help their colleagues in the region from all services, providing expertise and supplies in some cases to neighboring programs in the hope to build their drill programs and JROTC programs in general. They simply were two of the best ambassadors the sport of competitive drill has ever maintained. These two officers put forth almost 100 years of total service to the United States Marine Corps in various capacities and they both talked at length about their love and devotion to the cadets and how they used drill as the tool to better these cadets for a lifetime. And despite both of these individuals passing away several years ago, their untarnished legacy lives on within the Drill Hall of Fame!

The United States Air Force Honor Guard Drill Team

The U.S. Air Force Honor Guard originated in 1948 when Headquarters Command, U.S. Air Force, directed the creation of an elite ceremonial unit. This unit was activated within the 1100th Air Police Squadron at Bolling AFB, Washington, D.C., with the responsibility of maintaining an Air Force ceremonial capability in the National Capital Region. The Honor Guard officially became a separate squadron in 1972, and the unit remains at the base now known as Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling, Washington, D.C. The performance drill team has undergone many recent changes that propelled their inclusion into the Military Drill Hall of Fame. While they have always been a high profile ambassador, for many years they seemed to toil in the shadow of their more well known peers in the Army Drill Team and the Marine Corps Silent Drill Platoon. However, in the past few years, the level of professionalism, polish and overall excellence in presentation to both military and civilian audiences has risen to a level that is on par with any professional drill done anywhere on the planet. Their current routine blends very difficult maneuvers recently added to the routine but also leaves decades old favorites that play homage to the history of this illustrious group. It is an honor and privilege to feature the U.S. Air Force Honor Guard Drill Team within the National Drill Hall of Fame.

They have glorified drill excellence both in Florida and nationally for over 20 years. LCDR Bingham began the program in 1994. Chief Morales came onboard in 1997. Since their arrival the Boca Raton NJROTC program's enrollment has increased from just over 100 cadets a year to 365 cadets. They have won seven state titles and two national titles in the arduous Navy Academic, Athletic and Drill Championship event. Their drill has always led the unit pacing their top finishes with countless BEST OVERALL DRILL performance trophies. The NJROTC program has earned the coveted Distinguished Unit designation 19 times and it is considered one of the premier NJROTC programs in the country. LCDR Bingham retired after the 2015 school year while Chief Morales still works for the program. Few programs can or have EVER been able to boast the drill accomplishments and recognition that Boca Raton HS has maintained for that duration of time.

A Look Around the Nationals and JROTC Universe




